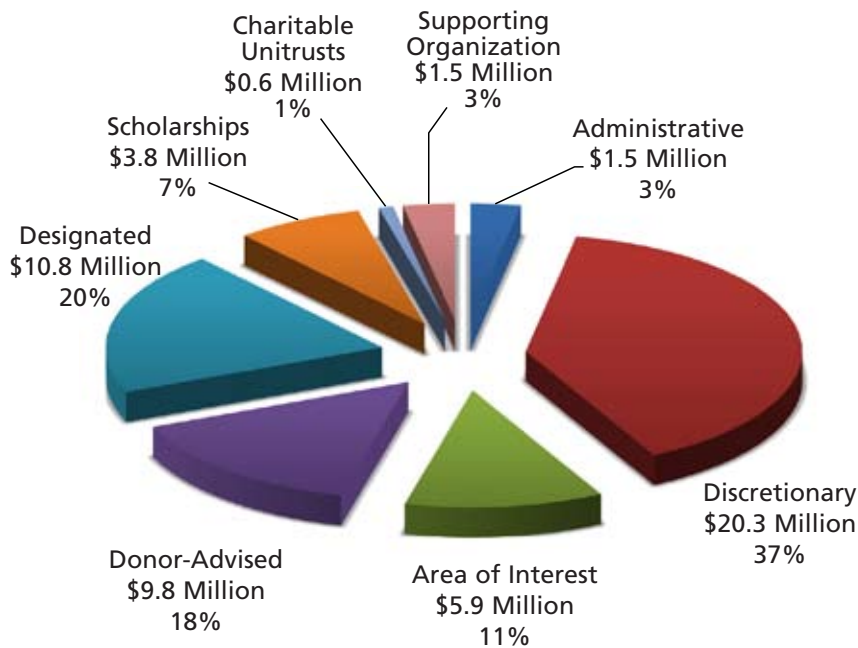

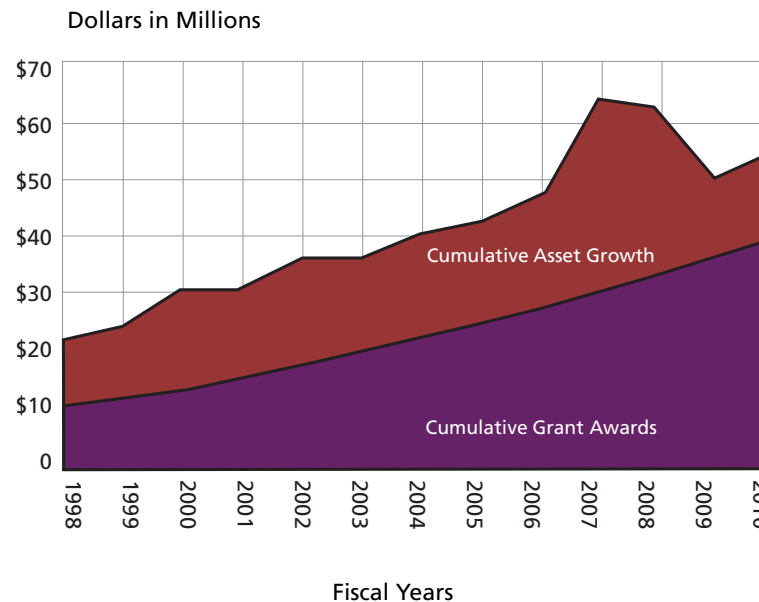
FISCAL YEAR 2010 FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

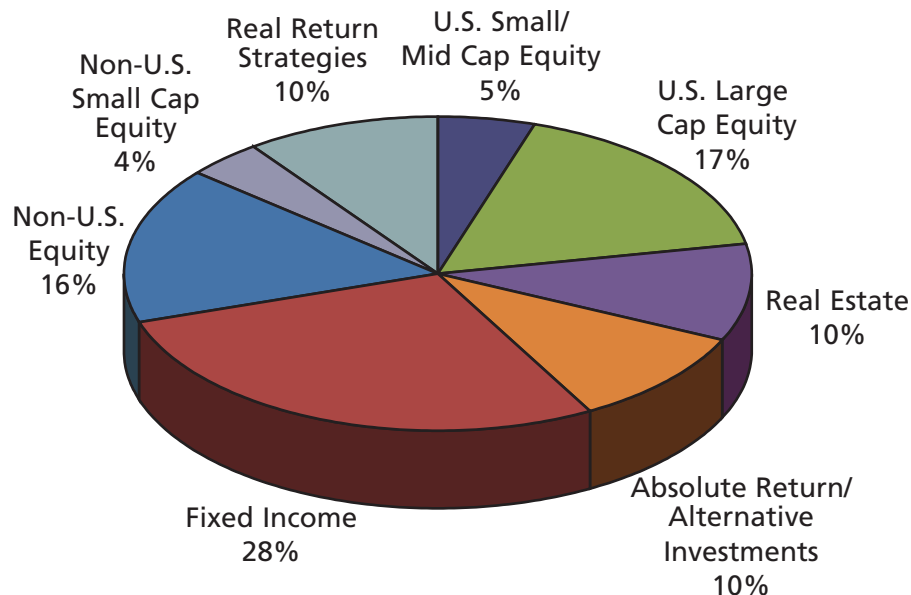

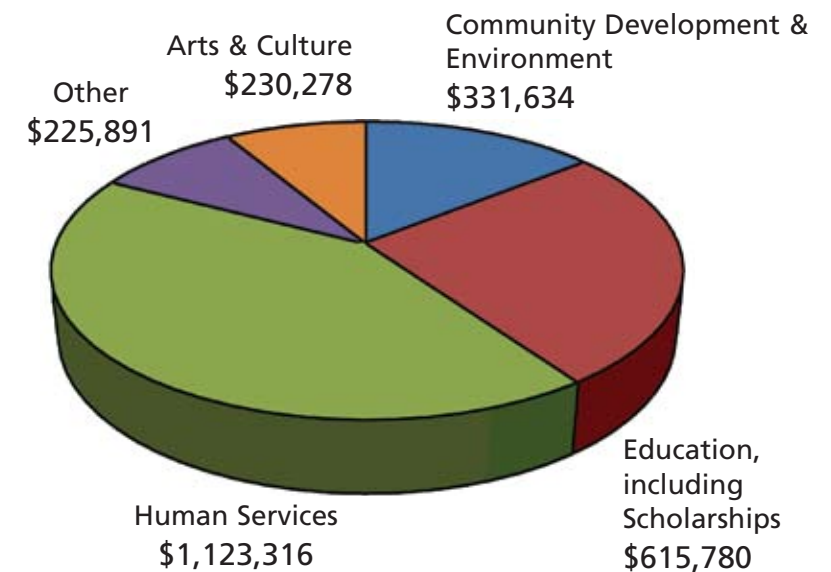

COMMUNITY GRANT AWARDS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2009 – JUNE 30, 2010

In fiscal year 2010, INWCF, in partnership with the donors we serve, awarded 88 community grants for a total of \$1,094,252 to charitable organizations. Nonprofit organizations applied for grants through seven community grants programs. Grants were made possible by donors who entrusted INWCF to invest their charitable dollars in programs and projects that promise the greatest benefit to the community. Grants staff, grant committees and board members reviewed proposals and selected programs to receive grants throughout the 20-county region INWCF serves.

Donor-Advised Endowed Funds

Similar to community funds, donor-advised endowments are permanent funds that allow donors to contribute assets at their convenience. With donor-advised endowments, the donor identifies one or more advisors, such as children or grandchildren, who recommend grants to support the issues and needs they care about most. Fund founders can also identify a specific area of interest for their fund. Donor-advised endowments are a wonderful way to nurture the spirit of charitable giving in younger generations and carry on a family tradition. Donor-advised endowments are a flexible, personalized way to support charitable activities in the Inland Northwest, elsewhere in the United States, or virtually anywhere in the world. A gift of \$10,000 or more can establish a donor-advised endowment. This type of donor-advised fund can be built with as little as \$1,000 each year for 10 years.

Inland Northwest Community Foundation honors the memory of Scott B. Lukins, a founder and former Board president of this community foundation. Scott passed away April 11, 2010.

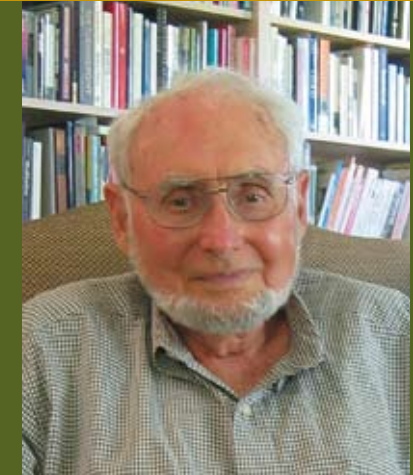

Community funds are permanently endowed to allow Inland Northwest Community Foundation (INWCF) the flexibility and discretion to meet critical needs and compelling opportunities in our region. Donors who establish community funds, or make a gift to an existing community fund, entrust INWCF to award grants to applicants who apply to the Foundation’s competitive grants programs. This type of unrestricted fund can be established with as little as \$5,000 payable with gifts of \$1,000 each year for five years. Many families use this approach to teach their children how a charitable investment can provide benefits for generations to come.

Inland Northwest Community Foundation honors the memory of Allan H. Toole, the first Board president of this community foundation. Allan passed away September 21, 2010.

A prominent attorney, in 1954, Allan became a senior partner in the law firm of Witherspoon, Kelley, Davenport and Toole. In 1974, Allan and three members of Spokane’s Junior League met to discuss establishing a community foundation. Allan drafted the Articles of Incorporation that were then signed by 23 local leaders, becoming one of the original founders of the Foundation.

Allan’s passion was civic and philanthropic work. His outlook towards giving to the community was rooted in his belief as an Eagle Scout: “Always leave your campsite in better condition than you found it.”

Area of Interest Community Funds

Donors can identify a specific area of interest for their community fund. This can be a geographic designation for charitable distributions such as Spokane, Sandpoint, Eastern Washington, North Idaho, or other towns and counties in the Foundation's 20-county service area. It can also include restricting the fund's charitable distributions to a specific population or program area. These endowed funds allow donors to define their interests as narrowly or broadly as they choose. Contributions of any amount may be made at any time to existing funds. Additionally, a gift of \$10,000 can establish a new endowed area of interest community fund.

A supporting organization is a good alternative to a private foundation because gifts used to establish a supporting organization qualify for more favorable tax deductions. Supporting organizations are nonprofit charitable organizations that qualify as “public charities” because of their affiliation with INWCF. They are not subject to the excise tax on net investment income or to any annual distribution requirement.

Charitable Remainder Trusts

Giving through a charitable remainder trust allows donors to receive tax benefits for their charitable gifts as well as income for the rest of their lives (or a set number of years) and use the trust “remainder” to establish a fund at Inland Northwest Community Foundation to benefit charity. This life income plan is carried out by transferring cash, stock, real estate or other assets into a trust and identifying a trustee, such as INWCF, to manage the trust assets and make payments to the donor. Using appreciated assets can reduce capital gains taxes.

Thanks to the foresight of those who established the Pullman Community Foundation in 1923, and transferred funds to Inland Northwest Community Foundation in 1982, the residents of Pullman and the Palouse region have a rich asset. Today, the Pullman community and the Palouse region benefit from 27 funds collectively totaling nearly \$1.9 million allocated to support that region.
